TUNISIAN REVOLUTION

BEFORE THE REVOLUTION

- Tunisia is controlled by a corrupt authoritarian government
 - Government takes bribes and confiscates merchandise from the poor
 - Authoritarian leader, Ben Ali, has billions of dollars from various corrupt practices
- Revolution starts because Mohammed
 Bouazizi sets himself on fire in protest



TUNISIAN REVOLUTION



DURING THE REVOLUTION

- Bouazizi's actions ignite a fierce protest
- Authoritarian leader Ben Ali
 initially promises not to run for re election when his term ends in
 2014
- Unsatisfied, protesters continue until Ben Ali steps down as president

AFTER THE REVOLUTION

- The Tunisians adopt a relatively successful democracy
 - The group that backed democracy when Tunisia had no government wins Nobel Peace Prize
- Beni Caid Essebsi has been president since December 2014

ANIMAL FARM

- Just as Ben Ali became corrupt as a political leader in Tunisia, Napoleon becomes corrupt as a political leader in *Animal Farm*
- Both these figures began their careers as fair rulers
- This reflects a problem with governmental systems in which one person has too much power
